The "aerial" view here shows 4 feasible locations, all of which are readily viewable by a substantial portion of villagers and visitors alike. The presentation would draw attention to the localities of earlier mining activity, namely: Wellspring and Ladyfield and also any nearby new housing that we all know is on the horizon.



 Four locations for an ironstone mining information board shown by this symbol. The most western one has the advantage of being installable immediately. The most eastern would be located along with an access road for new housing.

I have always maintained that a site near the mill is a barmy one and now wish to stress that any haste in installing the board would possibly miss an excellent site in relation to arrangements for new development.

Even so, the most westerly site is the basis for the picture below that gives an impression of how the display would sit in relation to the hedge that bounds the broad grass edging and the path there.



The Heritage Society have a wealth of relevant photographs to use which would ensure a fascinating display. The "Hill Railway" is a topic for the site near the mill, as I have stressed before, and we really should avoid mixing the stories.
